### General

Trees and shrubs offered are conservation-grade, bare-root stock. The SWCD does not guarantee survival and/or replacement of trees. Size is subject to change without notice. Refunds can only be made if stock is exhausted. Failure to pick up your order during scheduled dates could result in the loss of your payment. Non-native species offered are typically not invasive in our region.

### Variety Packets

All packets contain 20 trees (5 of each variety)

Evergreen: White Cedar, Norway Pine, White Pine, White Spruce

SHRUB: Arrowwood, Lilac, Nanking Cherry, Ninebark

Wildlife: Chokecherry, Red Dogwood, Red Oak, Red Splendor Crab

All shrubs and small trees are OK to plant near power lines.

Tall trees and evergreens should not be planted near power lines.

Arrowwood	12"-18"	6-15'/15'	Part	Y	Mod Growth, white flowers, blue berries, red fall color, birds. <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>
Ash, Mountain	12-18"	20'/20'	Full	Y	Slow growing, prefers rich soil, tolerates others, good for birds. <i>Sorbus americana</i>
Basswood	12-18"	100'/75'	Shade	Y	Tall, moderate growth rate, plant in moist well drained loamy soil <i>Tilia americana</i>
Birch, Paper	18-24"	50-70'/40'	Full	Y	Rapid growth prefers well-drained sandy loam. <i>Betula papyrifera</i>
Cedar, Red	9-15"	15-20'/8'	Full	N	Slow to moderate growth, does well in a variety of soil types. <i>Juniperus virginiana</i>
Cedar, White	5-10"	40-50'/15'	Shade	Y	Slow to moderate growth rate, plant in clay loams, sandy loams. <i>Thuja occidentalis</i>
Cherry, Nanking	18-24"	8'/15'	Full	N	Fast growing, prefers rich well drained soil, red fruit makes good jelly. <i>Prunus tomentosa</i>
Chokecherry	6-18"	25'/25'	Part	Y	Fast growing, loamy well drained soil, tart fruit, & good for jelly, syrup. <i>Prunus virginiana</i>
Crab, Red Splendor	36-48"	25'/20'	Full	N	Likes well drained loam, tolerant of other soils, pink, rose, or white blossoms. <i>Malus sp.</i>
Cranberry, Highbush	12-18"	16'/16'	Part	Y	Prefers moist well-drained soil, but not particular about type. <i>Viburnum trilobum</i>
Dogwood, Gray	6-12"	6'/12'	Part	Y	Not fussy about soil type, but prefers well drained. Has white flower. <i>Cornus racemosa</i>
Dogwood, Redosier	6-18"	11'/12'	Shade	Y	Fast growing, prefers wet sites, red stems. Winter color, food for deer. <i>Cornus sericia</i>
Elderberry	18-24"	9'/9'	Part	Y	Prefers loamy moist soil, favorite of songbirds, make wine & jelly. <i>Sambucus canadensis</i>
Fir, Balsam	4-7"	40-60'/20-35'	Shade	Y	Fast growth, Christmas tree, good for birds, mammals, pulpwood <i>Abies balsamea</i>
Grape, Riverbank	8"+	20-30'	Shade	Y	Found along streams or damp cool woods, sour, uses-jelly, juice. <i>Vitis riparia</i>
Hackberry	12-18"	30-130'/50'	Part	Y	Rapid growth, sweet edible nutlet. Moist soils. Not for Lake /Cook Cty <i>Celtis occidentalis</i>
Hazelnut	12-18"	10'-20'	Full	Y	Filberts edible, plant full sun, Produces 2 <sup>nd</sup> year, shallow roots, <i>Corylus sp.</i>
Juneberry	12-18"	8'/8'	Part	Y	Suckers, grows in all well drained soils, edible fruit, good for wildlife. <i>Amelanchier alnifolia</i>
Lilac (common)	18-24"	12'/12'	Full	N	Purple flowers. Plant in well-drained soil, attracts bees, butterflies. <i>Syringa vulgaris</i>
Maple, Red	12-18"	50-70'/60'	Part	Y	Moderate to fast growing. Prefers well-drained soil. Red, yellow in fall. <i>Acer rubrum</i>
Maple, Silver	8-16"	60-90'/75'	Part	Y	Grows in poor wetter soils, rapid growth rate. Yellow fall color. <i>Acer saccharinum</i>
Maple, Sugar	12-18"	60-80'/80'	Shade	Y	Slow-moderate growth, best in well-drained loam. Syrup, bright fall colors. <i>Acer saccharum</i>
Nannyberry	6-12"	15-20'/6-10'	Part	Y	Most soils, edible fruit- date flavor after frost, good for birds. <i>Viburnum lentago</i>
Ninebark	12-18"	10'/8'	Part	Y	Blooms flower clusters, slow growing. Good for difficult sites. <i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>
Oak, Bur	6-18"	70-80'/80'	Part	Y	Slow growth, Likes moist well-drained soil, will grow in other areas. <i>Quercus macrocarpa</i>
Oak, Red	6-18"	60-80'/50'	Part	Y	Fast growing, prefers well-drained rich moist soils. <i>Quercus rubra</i>
Pincherry	6-18"	30'/5'	Full	Y	Plant in full sun, could produce in 2 years, sour fruit for jelly <i>Prunus pensylvanica</i>
Pine, Jack	6-12"	30-80'/20-30'	Full	Y	Needs full sun, fast growing at first, birds and animals food, sawlogs <i>Pinus banksiana</i>
Pine, Norway	12-24"	50-80'/30'	Full	Y	AKA Red Pine. Moderate/fast growth, likes sandy well-drained soil. <i>Pinus resinosa</i>
Pine, Scotch	9-15"	60-95'/40'	Full	N	Rapid growth. Prefers well-drained fine sand or sandy loam. <i>Pinus sylvestris</i>
Pine, White	8-16"	80-95'/80'	Part	Y	Rapid growth rate. Prefers well-drained moist loam, silty loam. <i>Pinus strobus</i>
Plum, American	6-18"	25'/20'	Full	Y	Loam, sand, gravel well drained, rapid growing, edible red/yellow fruit. <i>Prunus Americana</i>
Rose, Hansen Hedge	18-24"	7'/6'	Full	N	Thorny, suckering, all soils, even poorly drained. Good for wildlife. <i>Rosa sp.</i> 'Hansens'
Sandcherry	24"-36"	3-6/3-6	Full	Y	Winter hardy, loamy soil, edible fruit, good for birds, deer browse. <i>Prunus besseyi</i>
Spruce, Black	5-12"	30-70'/15-3	Shade	Y	Shortest needle spruce, native to bog area, Moderate growth rate. <i>Picea mariana</i>
Spruce, Blue	10-16"	50-95'/25'	Part	N	Plant in med to fine soils well drained. Blue cast to needles. <i>Picea pungens</i>
Spruce, Norway	10-16"	90'/30'	Part	N	Fastest growing spruce, plant in med. to fine textured well-drained soil. <i>Picea abies</i>
Spruce, White	8-18"	40-80'/25'	Shade	Y	Rapid growing, plant in well drained med to fine soils, Christmas tree. <i>Picea glauca</i>
Sumac, Smooth	12-24"	5-15'/10-15	Full	Y	Fast growth rate, all soil types, good for wildlife, bank stabilization. <i>Rhus glabra</i>
Tamarack	6-12"	50'/75'	Full	Y	Wide range of soils, wet or dry sites. Loses needles in fall. Yellow fall color <i>Larix laricina</i>
Willow, Golden	18-24"	40-80'/35'	Full	N	Similar to weeping willow, grows in all soils especially wet areas. <i>Salix alba var. vitelina</i>
