## 2020 Native Tree & Shrub Descriptions^

Species	Scientific Name	Mature Size (height/width)	Light Needs	More about growth rate and soil preferences	
Ash, Mountain+	Sorbus americana	20' / 20'	Any	Slow growing, prefers rich soils, tolerates others. Red fruit stays through winter.	
Birch, Paper	Betula papyrifera	50-70' / 40'	Full	Rapid growth. Prefers well-drained sandy loam.	
Birch, River	Betula nigra	40-60′ / 24′	Full	Moderately fast growing. Prefers wet sites, tolerant of flooding.	
Cedar, White	Thuja occidentalis	40-50' / 15'	Any	Slow to moderate growth rate, prefers clay loams, sandy loams, lakeshores.	
*Cherry, Black +	Prunus serotina	50-75′ / 25′	Full	Well-drained sandy or loam, hardwood, black fruit matures late in season.	
*Cherry, Choke +	Prunus virginiana	25' / 25'	Part	Fast growing, loamy well drained soil, red-purple to blackish fruit.	
*Cherry, Pin +	Prunus pensylvanica	30′ / 5′	Full	Plant in full sun, could produce in 2 years, small white flowers.	
*Cherry, Sand +	Prunus besseyi	3-6′ / 3-6′	Full	Winter hardy. Loamy, dry, sandy, or rocky soils. Withstands drought.	
*Chokeberry, Black+	Aronia melanocarpa	3-6′ / 3-6′	Full	Red autumn leaves, white flowers, lasting fruit, adapts to most soils.	
*Dogwood, Red-Osier	Cornus sericia	11' / 12'	Any	Fast growing, prefers wet sites, red stems. Winter color, white flowers & fruit.	
*Elderberry +	Sambucus canadensis	9' / 9'	Part	Prefers loamy moist soil, white flowers, purple - black clusters of fruit.	
Fir, Balsam	Abies balsamea	40-60'/20-35'	Shade	Fast growth, prefers moist, loamy soil. Good for Christmas trees.	
Hackberry+	Celtis occidentalis	40-60′ /25-40′	Any	Slow to moderate growth. Drought resistant and wind firm	
Hazelnut +	Corylus americana	8-15' / 8-12'	Full/Part	Cold tolerant. Grows best in rich, well-drained soils. Shallow roots.	
*Indigo, False	Amorpha fructicosa	6/12' / 8-10'	Part/Full	Fast growth, prefers wet neutral soils. Purple blue flowers.	
*Juneberry +	Amelanchier alnifolia	8' / 8'	Part	Prefers loamy soils, tolerates sand and clay. Lovely fall colors, white flowers.	
*Maple, Red	Acer rubrum	50-70' / 60'	Part	Moderate to fast growing. Prefers well-drained soil. Red, yellow in fall.	
Maple, Silver	Acer saccharinum	60-90' / 75'	Part	Grows in poor wetter soils, rapid growth rate. Yellow fall color.	
*Maple, Sugar	Acer saccarum	60-80' / 80'	Any	Slow to moderate growth, best in well-drained loam. Syrup, bright fall colors.	
*Nannyberry +	Viburnum lentago	15-20' / 6-10'	Part	Well-drained to dry, even moist soils. Mildew growth common if too much shade.	
*Ninebark	Physocarpus opulifolius	10′ / 8′	Part	Medium to fast growing. Good for difficult sites, dry to wet, sandy, loam, or clay.	
Oak, Bur	Quercus macrocarpa	70-80' / 80'	Part	Slow growing, likes moist well-drained soil, will grow in other areas.	
Oak, Red	Quercus rubra	60-80' / 50'	Part	Fast growing, prefers well-drained rich moist soils.	
Oak, White	Quercus alba	60-80'/60-80'	Full/Part	Stately with purple fall leaves, likes deep, acidic, sandy loams.	
Pine, Jack	Pinus banksiana	30-80' /20-30'	Full	Needs full sun, fast growing at first, good for pulpwood, poles, and sawlogs.	
Pine, Norway (Red)	Pinus resinosa	50-80' / 30'	Full	Moderate/fast growth, likes sandy well-drained soil.	
Pine, White	Pinus strobus	80-95' / 80'	Part	Rapid growth rate. Prefers well-drained moist loam, silty loam.	
*Plum, American +	Prunus Americana	25' / 20'	Full	Prefers well-drained loam, sand, gravel. Rapid growing.	
Spruce, Black	Picea mariana	30-70′ /15-30′	Shade	Shortest needle spruce, native to bog areas, moderate growth rate.	
Spruce, White	Picea glauca	40-80' / 25'	Any	Rapid growing, plant in well drained medium to fine soils, Christmas tree.	
*Sumac, Staghorn	Rhus hirta	5-15' / 10-15'	Full	Fast growth rate, all soil types, good for bank stabilization.	
Tamarack	Larix laricina	50′ / 20′	Full	Wide range of soils, wet or dry sites. Yellow fall color; loses needles in winter.
