Local staff from those different regions will present brief overviews. Each one of you is a part of this committee to provide your geographic or topical expertise and insights, so no one is expected to know everything about the whole area, but a cursory understanding will be helpful in our work together.

Prioritizing the Issue Statements

We won't be able to do everything everywhere, so we need to begin narrowing down the list of issues and subissues by prioritizing the issue statements against each other. We'll use a web browser-based tool to assess your opinions for how to rank the issues against each other at the watershed and planning area levels, and use that exercise to lead into discussions about how to best move forward with next steps.
